NAME OF ACCUSED(S) Kinloch, Willow Morgan

Synopsis:

On 05.05.06 KINLOCH a 15 yr old youth was lodged in a padded cell for SIPP because of her extreme alcohol intoxication. After KINLOCH was reasonably sober police attempted to return her to her home. KINLOCH had no keys and police were unable to gain entrance into her parents residence. KINLOCH was apprehended and lodged for safety reasons.

While in cells KINLOCH lashed out and grabbed the Matron by the arm causing injury who was in the process of removing articles of clothing. KINLOCH was arrested and lodged for Assault. She was later released on a PTA after being fingerprinted and photographed.

Charges of Assault forwarded to Crown.

Narrative:

Subject: Occurrence Report

On May 6th 2005 at approximately midnight Willow KINLOCH was booked into cells for SIPP because she was extremely intoxicated. (See attached SIPP file 05-20684) KINLOCH was placed in the padded cell because the two youth cells were already in use. This ended up becoming a sound decision given the fact that KINLOCH proceeded to kick and punch the cell door as well as scream and yell, disturbing other inmates as well as jail staff. These actions were noted by the investigating officers Asmussen and O'Neill while they were in cells earlier for an unrelated reason. During their time in cells screaming and pounding could be heard reverberating throughout the jail.

The jail matron Merie EDMONDS was able to get a home address for KINLOCH and it was decided at 0435hrs to transport KINLOCH home. Once home, her parents could take custody of her and watch her until she was completely sober.

Cst(s) Asmussen and O'Neill transported KINLOCH to the address she provided of 1054 Pandora and while enroute KINLOCH stated to police that she didn't have keys to get in. Police attempted to buzz her parents but there were no "KINLOCHs" on the buzzer, and according to KINLOCH there was no phone number to reach them on until next week. This problematic situation was explained to her at length and it was related that because of the time of night, age and level of alcohol impairment, the police would not be able to release her to the streets for obvious safety reasons. KINLOCH was therefore apprehended under the Child Family and Services Act. KINLOCH was originally co-operative and relieved to be going home, once the realization sank in that she would not be going home, she began to argue and become upset at police.

Cst(s) Asmussen and O'Neill took KINLOCH back to cells until such time as someone could take custody of her. Upon arriving at cells KINLOCH became uncooperative and wouldn't exit the police vehicle despite several verbal commands to do so. The decision was then made to physically remove her from the vehicle which was accomplished by Cst. Asmussen and O'Neill.

KINLOCH kept repeating to the officers that she was not going to go back to cells and her physical resistance in refusing to walk was indicative of that. KINLOCH was then placed back in the padded cell and when EDMONDS attempted to have KINLOCH remove her shoes she threw one of them at EDMONDS. EDMONDS attempted to then take control of KINLOCH to prevent the assault and KINLOCH lashed out at EDMONDS who was grabbed by the left bicep causing redness and bruising. Csts Asmussen and O'Neill were outside the padded cell and in a position outside the door to observe KINLOCH complete this act. At this point Cst(s) Asmussen and O'Neill entered the cell and took KINLOCH to the ground and handcuffed her as well as used leg restraints to prevent any further assaults on police or jail staff. As such KINLOCH was no longer held under the Provincial authority to apprehend but rather the Criminal authority to arrest for assault.
