He said to us that he was deputizing us as police officers, as he was a R.C.M.P. and that if we did not act, we would be fined \$10,000.00 ten thousand dollars. I said to this fellow if he was an R.C.M.P. officer that I wanted to see his papers. He started to hollar that he wanted the Police, and wanted us to arrest the other fellows, at this the Engine arrived and I got up on the Engine, and I asked them to call the Police, which they did. At this time this fellow went down over the bank again to where the others were fighting. About 5 minutes later they all come up over the bank quite
