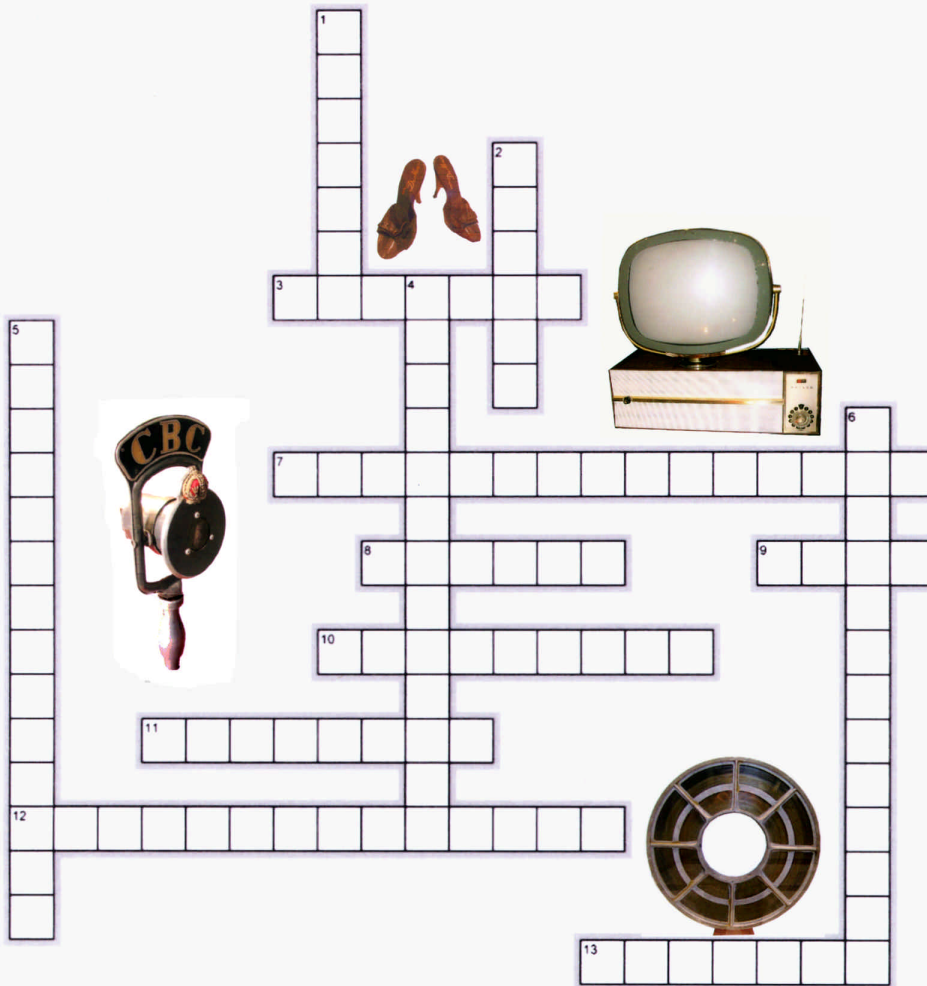


# The Harris Crossword

### ACROSS:

8. Name the manufacturer of the 1958 "Space Command" TV remote control. (Clue: Look behind the radio remote.)
9. Dancing and singing sensation Joyce \_\_\_\_\_ kicks up a storm in this excerpt from *Cross Canada Hit Parade*. (Clue: Look for a tiny pair of shoes.)
10. "Knock knock! Who's there?" Canada's first radio stars performed daily for the CBC radio show of the same name for more than 20 years. (Clue: Look for the organ.)
11. Prior to hosting *Jeopardy*, Alex Trebek was a popular announcer and host of CBC-TV programs, including this early 1960s teen pop-music show. (Clue: Look for a picture of a very young Trebek in the Collection Room window.)
