CAN'T BE ON PARLIAMENT HILL OR AT THE FIRST-EVER FIFA U-20 WORLD CUP CANADIAN GAME ON CANADA DAY? CBC WILL TAKE YOU THERE

CBC has something for everyone this Canada Day weekend from World Cup soccer as part of CBC'S extensive *FIFA U-20 World Cup* coverage to the country's brightest musical talent rocking live from capital hill. Live coverage will begin at noon ET, Saturday, July 1 on CBC Television and CBC Newsworld (live coverage to be broadcast on CBC Newsworld from 12 p.m. – 2 p.m. ET).

CBC Television and Newsworld – July 1

Beginning at 12:00 p.m. ET (two-hour broadcast) Peter Mansbridge and Heather Hiscox report on all of the Canada Day celebrations, live from Parliament Hill. Prime Minister Stephen Harper and Governor General Michaëlle Jean celebrate the festivities with an outstanding line-up of musical talent including Montreal singer Nikki Yanofsky, pop sensation Eva Avila, Delhi 2 Dublin, Corb Lund, Tanya Tagaq, Tomi Swick, Shaye and, performers from the National Circus School.

THE SEVEN WONDERS OF CANADA – ANOTHER LOOK

Peter Mansbridge and Rex Murphy host a special broadcast live at 2:00 p.m. ET on CBC Television and CBC Newsworld that looks back on Canada's choices for the nation's seven wonders.

CBC Sports celebrates Canada Day in perfect fashion, with coverage of Team Canada's opening game at the *FIFA U-20 World Cup*. The action kicks off at 7:30 p.m. ET on CBC Television and on CBC Radio One as Canada takes on Chile at BMO Field in Toronto. Play-by-play announcer Nigel Reed, the voice of **MLS ON CBC**, hits the broadcast booth with analyst Craig Forrest - one of the most recognizable and successful soccer players ever to come out of Canada - to call the highly-anticipated match. Mitch Peacock, a reporter and features host for **MLS ON CBC**, will report from the sidelines at BMO Field, keeping fans on top of all of the action. Host Scott Russell and studio analysts Dick Howard and Bob Lenarduzzi will provide intriguing insight and analysis from the studio during pre-game, half-time and post-game.
